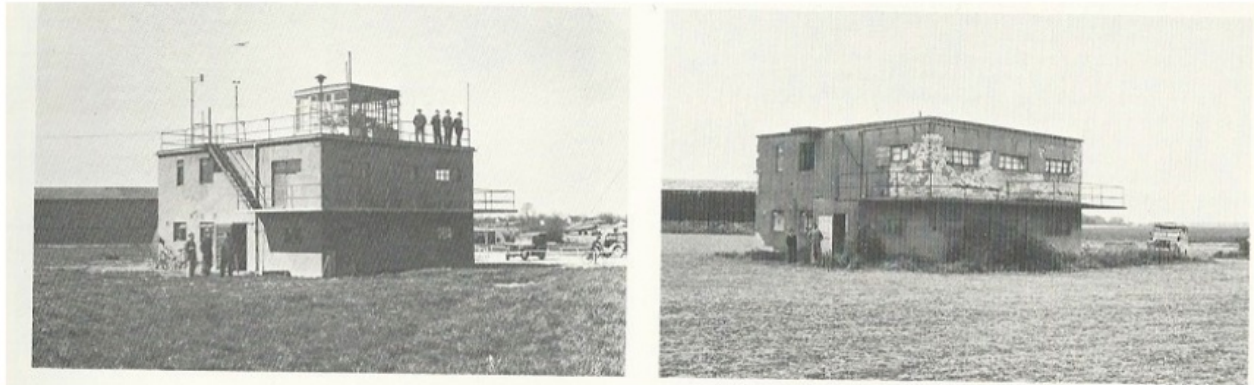


## **Airfields: Then and Now**
