Discover the huge contribution made by Ipswich Companies to the War effort, American Servicemen in the town, what cartoonist, Carl Giles did in the War, and our V.E. Night celebrations.

Martlesham Heath Airfield Walk

Time: 3pm (lasts approx. 2 hours)

Cost: FREE

Distance: 3½ miles.

Terrain: Easy.

Location: Meet at the Martlesham Heath Control Tower Museum, situated at the rear of Parkers Place (off Eagle Way), Martlesham Heath IP5 3UX. No booking needed

Join Community Archaeologist Martin Cuthbert, from the '8th in the East' project, for a walk through the historic airfield at Martlesham Heath, home to the 356th Fighter Group of the 8th USAAF during World War Two. If you're interested in landscape history, airfield archaeology, or just fancy the chance to have a walk in the unique urban landscape of this WW2 airfield, then this walk is for you. Martlesham Heath Control Tower Museum will be open prior to the walk for visitors from 2-5pm.
